What you need to know

- 1. The Youth Advisory Council (YAC) is a leadership group whose mission is to educate and serve the Gresham community through meaningful activities, educating our peers, appreciating diversity, and developing supportive partnerships between our schools and community.
- 2. YAC is made up of students in grades 9-12, who either attend Gresham area-based school districts (Gresham Barlow, Centennial, and Reynolds) or live in the city of Gresham.
- 3. YAC members must attend two meetings a month on the first and third Wednesdays at Gresham City Hall. Unless canceled due to weather and holidays.
- 4. Each year, new and current eligible members must apply.
- 5. Term runs for one year starting September 2022 June 2023.
 - All new and current members need to reapply before the filing deadline of May 3, 2023, to be a part of the 2023/2024 YAC.
- 6. YAC Leadership elected positions
 - YAC Chair Responsible for running meetings, attending meetings with YAC Advisor to plan meetings, setting up YAC goals for the 2022-23 year, and available to meet with elected officials to discuss policy and youth engagement work.
 - YAC Vice-Chair Responsible for running meetings with YAC Chair, acting as the Chair of the committee when Chair is not available, attending meetings with YAC Advisor to plan meetings and set goals for the 2022-23 year.
 - Secretary Responsible for taking notes for bi-monthly meetings and submitting them to YAC Advisor before the next meeting. Responsible for running meetings when YAC Chair and Vice-Chair are not available.
 - Ambassador Responsible for community relations. Contacting local news media when YAC is
 participating in events and taking interviews whenever prompted, as well as connecting with school
 communities about community service events.
