	 Suggestion for additional restrooms and signage to amenities along Springwater trail. Sidewalks needed in some areas to make parks accessible by foot. The Climate Action Plan will be reflected in the Parks Master Plan as the Parks 		

	 Master Plan will be a "systems" plan akin to other public infrastructure and will look at parks in the context of system-wide work, including the Climate Action Plan. Consideration of purchase of open space through the Parks Plan will need be evaluated through a gap analysis (e.g., gaps in proximity to park facilities). Parks are good for native trees (vs. streets and development landscaping). Work is being done to include natural spaces and areas as a part of the mapping system. Signage (directions, plant species, dangers, wildlife, etc.) are very helpful related to directions to facilities and open space education.

Discussion:	 The Comp Planning Team has focused on community engagement at community events across the city with the goal of understanding the community's vision for Gresham's trees. As part of the summer outreach, the Community Goals and Priorities Survey is now live on Engage Gresham (https://engagegresham.org/gresham-tree-code) and will be up through at least the end of August. The Comp Planning Team is currently working on an RFP for technical assistance from a municipal arborist for development of code update alternatives, review of draft code language, and creation of an urban tree guidebook (this will be the right tree right place technical tree manual) with updated approved tree lists. Continued collaboration with the UFS is anticipated to include work sessions at each project phase (dates TBD), plus additional work sessions as needed for specific project components such as the tree guidebook etc.

Discussion:	•	Gradin Sports Park Tree Planting UFS is expecting to look at the draft planting plan, specifically for the arboretum part of the park. The current planting plan is part of building permit number BLDC 23-06447.

	 UFS Work Plan Approval City Council gave it their informal approval in July, and it is scheduled to be formally approved at the 8/20/24 Council Business Meeting. Significant Tree De-Listing Process A Type II application will be processed by UDP staff. We will need the "City of Gresham Significant Tree/Grove Survey Form" completed for each of the three trees as part of the de-listing application. Process for Tree Code Violations Identified by UFS The UFS will need to report Tree Code violations through the "My Gresham" reporting page on the City's website (https://www.greshamoregon.gov/services/report-an-issue/mygresham/). Street Tree Planting – Code Project Update What was presented to the City Council in July are some quick Code changes, that are not larger policy issues and, in part, are designed to address the lack of street trees under the current Development Code for trees. At this point, these are ideas, not proposed Code language, and have been generated through multiple staff meetings over the past year. Minimizing conflicts with driveways and sewers Requiring alleys, where possible, before "fee-in-lieu-of" street trees (last option, not first) Requiring wider planter strips (10 feet) Discussions by the UFS was the genesis of this effort. Urban Forestry grant opportunity Bee City USA as an Urban Forestry grant opportunity but the grant application must be submitted by August 30, 2024. Information will be forwarded to the Chair.
