Discussion:	<ul> <li>Topped Trees         <ul> <li>Jim Buck brought up tree topping in areas of the City that have significantly less tree canopy and the concerns surrounding recurring topping. The properties brought up were at Weston Kia on Stark and Reigelmann's on Powell.</li> <li>Jim Buck proposed sending a letter to businesses to address their tree topping.</li> <li>Members discussed ownership vs right of way. Staff clarified that the Gresham Revised Code states that it is the owner's responsibility to maintain the right of way up to the back of the curb although it is considered City property.</li> <li>Staff reiterated that properties out of compliance receive a warning letter first, from code compliance, before being penalized.</li> <li>Required &amp; Significant Tree Pruning (9.1040)</li> <li>No discussion</li> <li>Reigelmann's</li> <li>Members would like to know what the City's response to the letter or addressing code compliances cases in this manner would be prior making further progress on the letter itself.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Approval of Meeting Minutes tabled until the next meeting.
